IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The Lockyer Horse Expo has free entry to the public – it is the opportunity for all studs, businesses or individuals that are in any way associated with the horse industry to show all horse people in South Eastern Queensland what is on offer in the Lockyer and surrounds. **Trade enquiries for the Expo are welcome.**

The cost of Sunday's Show:

You can enter and pay the entry fees on the day.

It costs \$50 (\$30 entry+ \$20 T.E.M.) to compete at the Exclusively Equine Welcome Show – that is a single **\$30** fee for one horse/one rider (or handler if the horse is not being ridden) that covers entry to all classes for which the horse and rider qualify, plus a **\$20 Temporary Event Membership** that covers the insurance for that rider/handler for the weekend (the Waiver must be completed & the T.E.M. wristband must be worn in the arena).

If you are a member of Dilutes Australia Ltd, your membership provides insurance coverage for one person named on the membership, so DA members will only need to pay the \$30 entry for the day.

If anyone needs an extra helper, handler, leader or strapper in the arena with them, that person will also need to complete a waiver, pay the \$20 Temporary Event Membership and wear the wristband. Spectators, helpers and strappers who remain outside the competition arena **do not need to pay** the Temporary Event Membership, but they **will not** be allowed into the arena unless they pay it, complete a waiver and wear the wristband

Only persons wearing one of the event's wristband will be granted entry to the arena where classes are being held. If anyone is in the arena without one of these wristbands, it voids the insurance – please follow this rule.

Repeating this important insurance information: All people entering the competition arena on Sunday must wear the wrist band that shows they have paid the \$20 Temporary Event Membership and signed the waiver. People outside the competition arena do not need to pay the Temporary Event Membership.

Stable and camping fees are extra (see attached forms). The management of the Gatton Show Grounds do not allow portable horse yards to be erected – horses must be tied to floats/trucks or in them, or be held or be stabled.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

WAIVER SAFETY ISSUES

All persons entering the ring must wear correct footwear (riding boots for riders; solid closed shoes or boots for others). Court shoes, sandals, thongs etc. are **not** acceptable.

While mounted, all riders must wear approved safety helmets. Exemption may be granted for advanced western riders in western classes, but helmets are preferred.

Saddles and bridles may be of any type (snaffle bits preferred, no illegal bits) but must be safe – no worn or frayed girths or stirrup leathers or reins.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1) This is intended to be a fun competition day and all classes, apart from the Best Presented classes, will be judged on any/all of the following: conformation, movement, behaviour, ability, correct workout, clean presentation. Only in the Best Presented classes will a show outfit be of any advantage to any competitor.
- 2) Judge's decisions are final – no protests or disputes allowed at this show: accept that different judges look for different things in different horses and riders. Smile.
- 3) The QB (Qld Branch) Committee has the power, without assigning any reason, to:
 - reject or cancel any entry at any time
 - prohibit the participation of any person or exhibit in any event
 - cancel any event or class, or combine or split any class or classes
 - alter the time at which any event or class is to take place
 - remove any exhibit or exhibitor from the showgrounds
 - transfer any exhibit or exhibitor from any class to another
- 4) The QB shall not be responsible for the loss of, or any damage or injury occasioned to, any exhibitor or the property of any exhibitor.
- 5) The exhibitor enters entirely at his or her own risk. In case any exhibit, whilst on the grounds, shall be the cause of any injury or damage to any other exhibit or exhibitor, or the person or property of any member of the QB or the general public, the owner of such exhibit shall indemnify the QB, its officers and members, from and against all damage, injury or loss occasioned to any of them by the exhibitor or their agent.
- 6) Any person causing annoyance by loud comments on the decisions of the Judges, or unseemly conduct or insulting behaviour, will, after being cautioned by an QB Committee member, be expelled from the Showgrounds, and said person may forfeit any prize money or trophies gained.
- 7) If entries exceed 12, then classes may be split.
- 8) 'Open' colour or dilute classes are open to both unregistered and registered horses/ponies.
- 9) 'Registered' classes are for registered horses/ponies only– handlers will need to produce a copy of the correct registration paper and show the steward to gain entry to that class.
- 10) In the DA registered classes for **palominos**, the usual DA rules about showing palominos apply (no bleaching or dying, no false tails in led DA Palomino classes, etc.). Any exhibitor who has been found to have dyed out spots or dyed or bleached a mane or tail of a palomino in a DA registered class will be disqualified. This does not apply to the 'open' palomino classes where unregistered palominos can be shown.
- 11) Any unregistered coloured or dilute horse/pony entered in a coloured or dilute class that is determined by the judge and/or QB Committee to be non-coloured or non-dilute will not be able to compete in that class (eg someone might think their flaxen maned chestnut is palomino when it is not).
- 12) Horses may be measured to ensure they are in their correct height classes.
- 13) Ribbons will be awarded to third place.
- 14) Performance competitors shall agree to abide by the rules set out in the Schedule.
- 15) All stallions and colts must be in the charge of a competent handler/rider 17 years of age or over, and must be under control at all times.
- 16) Spraying of horses (tick spraying) is entirely the responsibility of the owner.
- 17) The Management Committee reserves the right to change or amend the programme or the running order of the programme at their discretion.
- 18) All persons entering the ring must wear appropriate footwear.
- 19) All riders must wear an approved safety helmet at all times whilst mounted.
- 20) No DOGS, please – Council rules apply.
- 21) Any class rules not listed here will be judged at the Judges' discretion.

ORDER OF EVENTS

Saturday - 8.30am – 4pm The Lockyer Horse Expo. Free entry for the public.

There will be demonstrations during the day in the indoor arena. (Horses & Ponies are NOT to be led or ridden around the public during the Expo. Horses involved in Expo demonstrations must be led from their stables or float to the indoor with an extra handler to keep the public out of the way.)

Sunday - Exclusively Equine Welcome Show commences: 8.30am Led Events.

Led Events are divided into four rings

1. Led Ponies (under 14 hands)
2. Led horses 14 hands and under 15 hands
3. Led horses over 15 hands
4. for children aged fourteen and under who are leading their horse or pony (any height); younger ones are allowed assistance if needed.

At the completion of all led events, the ridden classes will commence.

Ridden classes are divided into five rings:

Rings 1 & 2 are for those riders who have been to less than five shows:

1. Walk & Trot classes only
2. Walk, Trot & Canter – simple workouts

Rings 3 & 4 are for more advanced riders and those who have shown more than five times

3. Walk & Trot classes only (suitable for your green or nervous horse or OTTT)
4. Normal Show Workouts
5. is a Lead-line ring.

Riders may stay in the one ring all day for their ridden events, or move up a ring if they gain confidence, or move down a ring if they wish. You may miss classes if you try and jump up and down rings. We rely on your honesty – we don't want to see experienced show riders trying to beat 'newbies' in rings 1 and 2

The Western Classes will commence in the indoor after events on the main arena have finished.

FEES

ENTRY FEE: \$50 which is made up of \$30 for one horse/rider (or handler) & gives entry to all classes for which they are eligible plus \$20 Temporary Event Membership (for insurance) for that rider/handler who must wear the wristband (DA members only pay \$30 entry – their membership provides one wristband)

STABLE FEE - \$25 each stable for each night (or any part of one day)
STABLE CLEANING FEE - \$25 per stable – refundable on cleaning to required standard

CAMPING FEE - \$20 per site per night

TIMES: Led classes commence at 8.30 and the ridden classes will commence after all led classes have been completed and the Supreme Led Of Show has been judged. As each ring completes their English style ridden classes, they can move to the indoor to commence their western classes.

Please buy some raffle tickets for the Henry De Rivel 16” unmounted show saddle valued at \$499 and other great prizes.

To help raise funds to cover the costs of the Welcome Show, please buy raffle tickets from Dilutes Australia Qld Branch – the raffle will be drawn during Sunday afternoon.

LED EVENTS

Your horse or pony will remain in the one ring for all its led events as these are height rings – horses and ponies may be of any type, the terms 'Pony', 'Galloway' and 'Hack' are referring to heights only. They can be shown in a halter, show halter or bridle. If numbers in any class exceed 12, the class may be split at the Judge's discretion. Extra classes may be added on the day. For 'registered' classes, competitors MUST carry a copy of their horse's registration papers and a copy of current membership to show the steward in order to gain entry to that class. All classes except 'registered' classes are open to unregistered and registered horses/ponies. The 'less than five shows' classes are for those starting out who may never have shown or only shown a couple of times – this refers to the person; the

horse may or may not be an experienced show horse – you **cannot** show in both the 'Less than 5 Shows' and the 'I've shown quite a few times' classes.

RIDDEN EVENTS

The ridden classes will commence after all led classes have finished and the Supreme Led of Show has been judged.

Do not ride your horse unless you are confident you can ride safely around other horses – the 'walk trot' rings are not designed for beginner riders, they are for people who can ride well but who just don't want to canter their horse.

If you have shown five times or less, you can be in Rings 1 or 2. If you have shown more than five times or are an extremely competent rider, you can be in Rings 3 or 4. You can pick a ring & either stay there for all your events or move up a ring if you or your horse gains confidence or move down if you feel you'd be happier there BUT you cannot compete twice in the same class in different rings and you should not be in Rings 1 or 2 if

you already know a lot about showing.

RING 2: 'I'm On My Way' – the CWA Ring: "Canter With Amusement"

'Maiden' means has not won a first prize in a ridden class before this show.

'Pleasure Hack': snaffle bit, no spurs or whip – horse should look a pleasure to ride

'Open Dilute' – Palomino, Buckskin, Cremello, Perlino, Dun, Silver (taffy),

Champagne or Pearl, registered or unregistered – if they have 'excess white' the judge will move them to the 'Open Pinto' class.

'DA BCD' – horses must be registered with DA as Broken Coloured Dilutes.
